She started her career at the Data Entry Plant, where she worked for 5 years. Bronwynn was grateful to have work that gave her a sense of purpose and taught her work ethic in a professional environment. She later joined the Design Plant where she discovered her passion for design. Bronwynn soon became a team leader and was able to earn various professional certificates. Towards the end of her incarceration, she was fortunate to get into a work-release program, working at MCE. Upon her release, she was offered a full-time position at MCE Headquarters. Bronwynn has been utilizing the skills she learned at the design plant in her current position, but she continues to look for opportunities for professional growth. Since her release, she earned a Project Management Certification and is currently finishing her Bachelor of Science Degree.

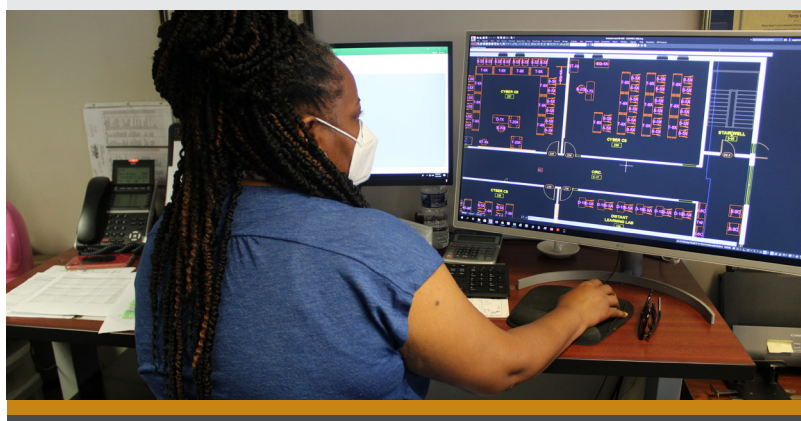
